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Doctors in England and Wales have a statutory duty to notify a 'Proper Officer' of the local authority, often the CCDC (Consultant in Communicable Disease Control), of suspected cases of certain infectious diseases:

Notifications of infectious diseases, some of which are later microbiologically confirmed, prompt local investigation and action to control the diseases. Proper officers are required every week to inform the HPA (formerly the Registrar General) anonymised details of each case of each disease that has been notified. The HPA has responsibility for collating the weekly returns from proper officers, and publishing analyses of local and national trends.
